We decided last week to continue the hot lunches one more round. We skipped your turn this round and so your turn will be Tuesday. If you are not there though we will postpone your turn.

Last Friday we made little rabbits out of paper with pussy willows glued on them to look like fur. We finished one side so we are going to finish the other side to-morrow.

Yesterday it got so dark in school that I took Jeanette home at 10 o'clock to get a lamp. We had it lit till noon and then turned it off. After dinner again though we needed it for about an hour.

No one else has had the measles or been absent the last two weeks.

Delbert has been getting water this week and Pat did last week. It surely helps me a lot and I can certainly notice it since I took it all winter.
