### BUILDING RENTALS

The Manning Community Center has building areas including a meeting room, stage, and gymnasium which are available to non-profit groups for rental throughout the year.

### LOCKER RENTALS

New this year will be individual locker rentals. Lockers in both the men's and women's locker rooms may be checked out for one year from the date of issue for \$ 10.00.

### WHIRLPOOL

A Jacuzzi whirlpool which seats 6-8 persons comfortably will be available to the public from September 16-May 16. Temperature is set from 99-101° F. Persons who are elderly, have heart conditions, or high or low blood pressure should consult their doctor before using the whirlpool for the first time.

### ROLLERSKATING

Supervised skating in the gym of the MCC, Saturday nights, 7-10 P.M. October 26 - April 19. Skate rental 50¢. Children's size 12 - adult size 13 are available in limited quantities. One hour rental time limit if persons are waiting.

### VOLLEYBALL

Enjoy a pick-up volleyball game or get your team ready for league play. Sundays, Oct. 20 - Nov. 24, 5-7 P.M. & Wednesdays, Nov. 6 - Dec. 11, 7-8 P.M.

### INTELLIVISION

An intellivision with a dozen cartridges is available to the public during Kid's Night and some other times. A fee of 50 ¢ is required for 30 minutes of play with a maximum of three cartridges checked out.

### TABLE TENNIS

A table tennis area is located in the balcony of the gymnasium. Netting has been placed around the balcony to keep balls playable. Equipment at the MCC office requires a refundable \$ 1.00 damage deposit.

# RACQUETBALL COURT INFO

## POLICY

1. Equal priority for reserving a racquetball court-time will be given to persons who pay either daily fees or have memberships.
2. Persons may reserve a court time in person or by phoning the MCC office at 653-3861. Court-times may be reserved up to three calendar days in advance. Example: Persons may reserve a court time for Thursday anytime on Monday.
3. Persons are limited to 1 - one hour reservation per day. This includes persons playing doubles.
4. Black soled shoes, black racquetballs, and racquets without faceguards will not be allowed in the racquetball court.

## COURT-TIME FEE

A fee of \$ 1.00 per person will be required for each hour of court-time either reserved or first come - first serve. The only exceptions to this policy are wallyball and racquetball lessons.

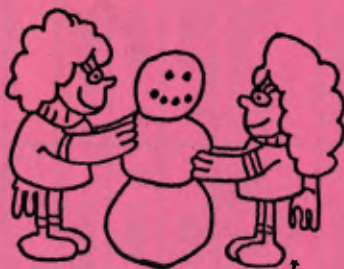
